All are welcomed to their new positions. Discussion continued of the Guild’s Constitution and By-laws. Various versions were discussed. The Board felt that there was a need for update and consolidation to meet the Guild’s needs into the future. Nancy will head a committee consisting of herself, Betz, Jean, Sharie, & Linda. The committee will meet throughout the summer to present something to the Board in August. Anyone else interested may call Nancy for times and dates.

**Vice President:** The new lease and indemnity agreement with the First United Methodist Church of Mesa, for our general meeting room was discussed and approved by the Board. Betz will deliver the new lease, a \$50 charitable donation (previously approved by the Board) and thank you note from the Guild. A special potluck dinner/ planning meeting are planned at Betz’s home with the new officers on May 24. They will organize for next year and develop a central goal for the Guild. Each new officer will develop updated Job descriptions and notebooks.

**Secretary:** Paul presented the board with a binder of the past minutes of the Executive Board from 1979 – 2000. It will be housed in the Library for those interested in doing a history of the Guild or just reminiscing. From 2001 to current is in process. Some years were missing and the Board will be checking their records to see if we can fill in those years.

**Treasurer:** The checking balance is \$3794.24. **A dues increase was approved by the general membership at the March General Meeting on March 13, 2011.** It was noted that because of the fiscal year, all checks written for next year’s dues will be held and not deposited until June 1, 2011. Please remember our “special”. A preliminary year end statement was discussed with the Board. It was noted that it was close to breaking even with this year’s budget. A finalized statement will be produced after fiscal year end.

**Ways and Means:** The board made note of the tremendous job that Sharie has done. She has helped greatly to support the budget this year. She discussed with the board extra copies of books in the library that might be sold. She noted the Stash Sale for our May meeting. **The board passed a resolution that the Guild will receive 15% of the sale prices of items sold by members at the Stash Sale.**

**Membership:** Please note the approved increase in dues to \$25.00 Individual (Family - \$30.00) beginning 1 June 2011. However, as a onetime special: if dues are paid on or before 30 May, 2011 (end of fiscal year), the dues will be \$20.00 Individual (Family \$25.00) for next year, 2011-2012 only.

**Hospitality:** Remember our Stash Sale and Pot Luck Dinner on May 11 as our year-end celebration. Details in the newsletter. Remember to bring yourself, food and money!

**Other Items Discussed:**

- There was discussion concerning the Jean George Award at the Intermountain Weavers Conference. The Guild sent the criteria to be used as we will sponsor the Award. There will be a ribbon awarded, handmade by our own Cynthia Broughton, but at present no monetary award. This is a onetime award. Discussion continued of adding a possible monetary amount to the award.
- Linda reported that the Weaving Study Group will be meeting to discuss a goal of making items to be entered at the Arizona State Fair and also encourage members to make an item that might be considered at FTT for the Jean George Award.
- Summer meetings of the Guild will be held on 6/8, 7/13, and 8/10. Details will be in the newsletter.
- There will be no Board Meeting for May. We have not seen many members at our Board meetings. They are open to all Telaraña Members and you are encouraged to attend. See you in August.

Navajo weaving experienced significant stylistic and status shifts during the 20th century. *A Turning Point* features 30-plus pieces that epitomize the gradual change in Navajo weaving that took place from the 1970s into the 1990s, as a traditional craft transformed to include name artists exploring new aesthetics and showing in urban galleries.
