Annual Sale – December 2, 2023

Hope you are having a good summer. Telarana's annual winter sale to be held at East Mesa Christian Church, will be here before we know it. We hope you have been busy creating some wonderful things for our annual sale. Thank you to those who completed the survey where we asked members about their preference of dates and style of the sale.

The sale will be on December 2 with inventory intake and set up on Dec. 1. We will continue with the boutique style of set up as in the past. We may experiment with a few people to take care of their own table. Details for that are yet to be worked out.

Here are a few guidelines that everyone will need to be aware of:

1. You must be a Telarana member to be a seller. To be a seller, you will pay a \$10 fee, plus, Telarana will keep 15% of your sales. Seller will keep 85%. Telarana will collect and pay the taxes.

2. The maximum number of items you may bring is 50. (If any of those items you bring are small, you must bring display equipment for those items.)

3. Any item for sale must be textile related or use a fiber related technique.

4. Intake will happen Dec. 1 from 4:30 to 5:30. If this time doesn't work for you, contact Cindy Reynolds to work out an arrangement.

5. Positioning of items on the display tables/equipment will be done by a committee of 4. Doing it this way, will eliminate any confusion.

6. As much as possible, each seller will be present at the end of the sale (3 p.m. - Dec. 2) to take their unsold inventory home.

7. Starting in October, there will be an inventory form/directions on our website for each seller to complete.

8. There will be a need for many volunteers and a sign-up sheet for that will be available at our fall general meetings.

#### A New Telaraña Exhibition Opportunity

Telaraña has been offered an exhibition by the Center for Humanities in Medicine at Mayo Clinic; this means that we are now included in their loaned artwork program and may be considered for future shows. We have been offered an exhibit opportunity in their **Pharmacy Gallery from December 13th, 2023 to March 13, 2024.** The Gallery is located in the Mayo Clinic Building at 13400 East Shea Blvd. in Scottsdale.

The space will include 30 feet of display length; photos of the gallery space appear below.

Here is the most important information you need to know about the show:

1. You must be a paid member to participate.

2. Images must be received by **November 10.** All images must be accompanied by hanging dimensions and artist/title/ media and a contact method for each artist (phone or email).

3. This is an exhibition, not a selling show; however, each piece will have a QR code with artist information. If someone chooses to purchase a piece, Mayo would not be involved in the transaction and the sale could only take place until after the show.

4. We would like to present a consistent body of work following the theme of **landscape**, but this does not have to be an Arizona land-scape. There is no time limitation of when the piece was created. Please let us know if you would like to submit a piece that appeared in either of our two past shows.

5. Mayo is a non traditional gallery space. There will not be a formal opening although people can view the gallery in groups of 2-4. It is open Monday-Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and closed Saturday, Sunday and holidays. Please be aware that the space will be lit 24/7 with LED lighting. As this is a healthcare facility, subjects **not** allowed in-



clude anything medical or body oriented, anything explicitly religious, threatening or aggressive, or contain food or drink imagery. No functional items such as clothing or household linens.

6. All pieces must be received at the gallery ready to hang. All Mayo Galleries utilize a hanging rack system that accommodates a wide range of artwork dimensions. This system requires screw eyes or bullnose hardware attached to the back of each piece in order to connect to the systems hooks; hanging wires across the backs of frames are insufficient for installation. Pieces may not be larger than 4' tall or smaller than 8" x 10". Since this is "hanging gallery", no 3-D pieces can be submitted.

7. The guild's insurance policy with Hartford will cover your pieces during the run of the show.



Finally, please let us know by **September 15** if you intend to submit a piece for consideration. If you have any questions, please contact Maureen McCarthy xxx. We're looking forward to a great show!

Secretary's Report: Carol Gordon was not present. Nancy Ryan functioned as secretary. Nancy moved to accept the previous minutes as distributed; seconded by Claudia.

Treasurers Report: Cindy reported that our current checking account balance is \$13,114.74. To date 31 members are current with dues

The proposed budget for guild year 2023-24 was discussed and amended. Nancy proposed that we accept the amended budget; second by Claudia.

Old Business: Up-cycle Challenge: Nancy stated that we will be continuing with the challenge until the end of the calendar year

New Business:

- Mayo Clinic Pharmacy Gallery Exhibit : Cindy reported that the exhibit will be up form December 13, 2024 until March 13, 2024 and the theme is Landscapes. Maureen McCarthy will put details in the newsletter.
- Mentoring new board members: Lee purposed that we start now to talk about the board positions that will vacate this year and encourage member to speak up now if interested. Anybody expressing interested could be mentored by the person currently in the position. Anybody interested should let Lee or Nancy know.
- Arizona Fiber Festival The festival, sponsored by the Federation, in April 5-7, 2025 in Camp Verde. Lee expressed concern that only one person from our guild has submitted a proposal to teach. We also discussed a guild booth which would be a 10x10. Do demonstrations was favored. Ellie will not be available to coordinate at that time.Vendor booths will be available for anyone who wants to sell for \$200. Lee stated we should promote this event at our fall meetings.
- TOWARD 2050 Nancy shared that Ann Morton has announced her next project which will be done in collaboration with Phoenix Desert Botanical Garden.
