FAC has first art show

Visit the online show and vote for your favorite!

The inaugural art exhibition for the new Fiber Arts Center AZ (FAC), opens **Dec. 1 through Jan. 31, 2025** on the nonprofit's website at FiberArtsCenterAZ.org.

There were 62 pieces submitted representing different types of fiber art for the "Best of FAC Founding Members' Showcase," reflecting the expertise and creativity of the FAC's members. Shelly White, a fiber/mixed-media artist using hand-dyed and printed textiles, juried the show and will present 11 awards including first, second, third, honorable mentions, best use of complementary colors, best timely message, best wearables plus others at a virtual art reception from **4-6 p.m., Fri., Dec. 6 on Zoom.** Members and prospective members are invited to attend by emailing FiberArtsCenterAZ@qmail.com for the link.

Those seeing the virtual show may also vote for a Viewer's Choice award which will be awarded at the close of the show.

"We are thrilled to show off our fabulous members' work," says Laurie Fagen, vice president of the organization who oversaw this exhibition. "We want to educate collectors and the public about the way fiber of all kinds can be used in fine art."

Most pieces are available for purchase, and shipping arrangements will be made separately by the artist and the buyer.

The organization's mission statement says, "A fine arts organization promoting fiber arts and serving the community through education, exhibitions and honoring cultural heritages." The goal of the 501(c)(3) is to have art center specifically dedicated to fiber arts with classrooms, an exhibition gallery, a dyeing studio, and a gift shop.

A Founding Member campaign is underway until the end of the year where members can join for \$50 to help the organization grow. The FAC already has nearly 50 members from the United States and Canada.
