Telarana Guild Board Meeting August 27, 2025

Secretary's Report: Carol Gordon presented the important highlights of the April 30, 2025 Board minutes. Nancy moved for minutes to be approved. Vote approved April minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Linda Wade presented the 2025-2026 Anticipated Budget. The projected income will increase with anticipated gains with Ways and Means profit from raffles and yearly auction, and the CD investment interest. Income projected - \$3450.00. Expenses with budget for membership and library adjusted is projected to be \$5545.00. Current working bank balance \$5942.70.

Karen Zorn scholarship fund available \$155. CD invested 5 months is \$8,000.00. There was a discussion on possible donations to Adopt an Elder and/ or the Fiber Arts Center AZ (FAC). Carol will look into if FAC has established a guild membership fee. The new year's adjusted budget was moved for approval by Nancy and seconded by Ruth. Budget approved.

Ruth will meet with the church to sign new year's contract. During the change of authorized signers on our bank account, it was discovered that previous officers should be removed. These minutes are to reflect that the only current authorized signers on the Telarana account should be Ruth Hallows, president and Linda Wade, treasurer. All others signers should be removed, including Winnie Johnson, Lee Killpack and Nancy Ryan, if they are still listed.

Old Business: Ruth and Nancy stated that there is a panel that will look into options for the guild's December Sale.

New Business: The board has agreed to temporarily change the time for board meetings. Meetings will be held the last Wednesday of each month at 5 PM.

Paula gave an update on the Federation's Camp Verde April 10-12, 2026 Fiber Arts Festival. She encouraged the guild to reserve a booth at no charge.

Winnie talked about what Telarana did will the booth assigned last year. The form for booth reservation will be completed and a booth reserved. Winnie and Lee are working on goodie bags for the event and a gift basket. Please notify them if you have anything you can contribute. You can keep current about plans on the Federation website: AZFed.org

Deb brought up the fact that many of the job descriptions for chair positions are out of date. Linda agreed and will look into revisions. She will send out new job descriptions for review.

Committee Reports: Programs – Sandi, Ruth and Nancy reminded us that sharing summer studies or projects is the program for the September meeting. Federation – Note Federation news stated under new business.

Historian – Russ had no report

Hospitality – Board is in charge of snacks for September meeting

Library – Karen will be asked if available books and items are current on the Telarana website

Publicity – no chair

Membership – Deb will review committee chair job description with Linda.

Ways and means – Winnie is confident that we have a number of items for our raffles

Website – Website is up to date and Linda will meet with Sandi to hand over notebook.

Workshops – Jean stated that Nancy will be teaching a Kumihimo class in November. Sites for the workshop will be explored.

Newsletter – Sharie notified the board she will step down as chair and Lavender Boyles will take over. Lavender has previously produced the newsletter. Linda will contact Lavender to confirm.
